Best for Alpine charm CHAMONIX

Admittedly, France doesn't really 'do' chocolate-box Alpine charm so there's not a great deal of competition in this respect. But the old mountaineering centre of Chamonix (*below*), still a proper working town, ranks among the most characterful resorts in world skiing. Located at the foot of Mont Blanc, it also has some of the most demanding ski terrain in the Alps – not to mention jaw-dropping scenery. It really does have everything – from cobbled streets to glorious *fin de siècle* architecture and a great Alpine museum. And as a reminder of the huge gladers draped around the mountains above it, a river runs through the bustling centre, fed by the biggest glader of all – the awe-inspiring Vallée Blanche.



Best for value LA MONGIE

You get more for your money in the French Pyrenees than in the French Alps, but don't assume for a moment that they're the poor relation. At 5,900ft, La Mongie is a modern and sophisticated ski station at the foot of the Pic du Midi, part of the route of

The Pyrenees are no poor relation to the Alps – the thermal baths work wonders on aching muscles the Tour de France. A big part of the resort's appeal is that it is linked to the charming old Napoleonic spa town of Barèges, France's second-oldest ski resort, on the edge of the Parc National des Pyrénées; the bonus is that the thermal baths work wonders on aching muscles and joints. And if you need a more spiritual cure, visit the pilgrimage town of Lourdes, just a 40-minute drive down La Vallée de Luz.

AUSTRIA Mayrhofen: Altitude Festival March 26-31 Snowbombing April 9-14

This popular Tyrolean ski resort holds consecutive annual festivals devoted to comedy and music. SWITZERLAND Zermatt Unplugged April 17-21

Now in its fifth year, this festival started as a one-off concert in the basement of a

boutique hotel in Zermatt, the über-fashionable ski destination at the foot of the Matterhorn. Since then, the headliners have included Lionel Richie, Alanis Morissette, Billy Idol, Gabrielle, Seal and David Gray. It now has eight stages and looks set to become the Glastonbury of the Alps, but with better toilets and scenery – and infinitely better food. Could the 2012 line-up. include one of the festival patrons – local resident Frida from Abba?
